THE HUMANITY OF MAN CORE OF THE ESOTERIC SCIENCES

One of Joseph Majdalani's weekly lectures was held earlier this month at Belrut University College (BUC). It was entitled "Esoteric Science, the Science of the Inner Self".

In this lecture, Majdalani revealed the origin of these sciences, which study the "invisible aspects of the human being, known as the inner bodies".

He explained telepathy and what he said was the effect of the planets on human behavior and on dreams, explaining that the "real and direct way to realize one's self is the actual application of whatever one's learns, since application is the laboratory of life where one can experience knowledge". He mentioned in this respect that the esoteric sciences are neither theories, nor philosophies, nor yet a mere science, but a way of life open to everyone. Everyone, the lecturer said, can "evolve himself, widen his scope of vision, learn how to strengthen his positive

traits, and get rid of the negative ones".

'Esoteric' is indeed the application of the ancient Greek adage 'Know thyself'. He spoke also of the "elixir

of life" which, he said, was human love "which realizes happiness", and of the "philosopher's stone", which was "consciousness that

understands knowledge and transforms it into experience."

In the discussion that followed with the audience -- which included students, faculty and members of the public -- Majdalani touched on various subjects such as life and death, the latent powers of human beings, the means of human evolution, the future of humanity, illnesses, their causes, and means of prevention...

Majdalani emphasized that happiness was something which could be attained as a reality by ordinary people, and that the vast store of human knowledge available to mankind today can indeed be turned to the advantage of humanity to enable us to reach that happiness.

The key was the esoteric sciences, which he said formed the best way of enabling people to make effective use of the talents and powers they possess, but which in most of us lie largely untapped.
